Although most prisoners are men, there are women as well. Many of them are still quite young, with their ages ranging from 25 to 50. Do you ever wonder what kind of crime they committed that led them to end up in prison? Drugs are always the number one cause, followed by physical abuse, fraud, and in some cases, joining their husbands in illegal activities. My heart goes out to their children!

May God lead all of them to read this book with open hearts and minds, so that they may be convicted of their sins, turn to the Lord, and be saved. Hopefully, one day, their children will also hear the Gospel.

Juvenile Observation and Protection Center (Youth Detention Center)

Now, let me tell you about the young people in the Juvenile Observation and Protection Center across different parts of Thailand. There is a total of 58 locations nationwide, divided into 44 juvenile detention centers and 14 juvenile and youth training and development centers.

It is very sad to see so many young kids end up in juvenile courts because of their illegal acts, most of which are related to drugs. These youths are typically between 15 and 18 years old.

Last month, a female prisoner named Regina wrote us a letter to share that she gave her life to the Lord after reading my book. She also explained that the book has greatly helped her in understanding the Bible. Praise God for her salvation!
